To participate in Youth Apprenticeship a student **MUST**:

- Be a high school junior or senior in Fall 2014
- Have a job or actively searching for a job
- Commit a minimum of one year to the program (450 hours of work + related curriculum*)
- Maintain acceptable grades and attendance at school.

*related technical instruction is based on program area and coursework availability

The Youth Apprenticeship (YA) Program is a unique school-to-work program that integrates school-based and work-based learning to instruct students in employability and occupational skills defined by Wisconsin industries.



Youth Apprenticeship Program Areas



- **Agriculture, Food & Natural Resources**
(landscaping companies, veterinary clinics, farms)



- **Architecture & Construction**
(architectural firms, construction companies)



- **Arts, AV & Communication Technology**
(graphic design agencies, printing companies)



- **Finance**
(banks, credit unions, insurance companies)



- **Health Science**
(hospitals, residential facilities, pharmacies)



- **Hospitality, Lodging & Tourism**
(hotels, restaurants, catering companies)



- **Information Technology**
(IT consulting, repair, programming offices)



- **Manufacturing**
(food & beverage, metal, textile producers)



- **Science, Technology, Engineering & Math**
(research labs, architectural firms,)



- **Transportation, Distribution & Logistics**
(warehouses, auto & collision repair shops)
